Act of Contrition

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you and I detest all my sins because of your punishments but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all good and worthy of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.

Rite of Penance

Priest: Welcomes the penitent.

Penitent: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen (make the sign of

the Cross).

Priest: Invites the penitent to have trust in God. The priest or penitent may read a text of Holy Scripture.

Penitent: Bless me Father; it has been _____ (how long) since my last confession. These are my sins:

Tell the priest your sins with honesty and sorrow, and also tell the priest a little about yourself.

The priest will listen to you and guide you.

Penitent: I am sorry for these and all my sins.

The priest will give you a penance to help make up for your sins and to change your heart.

Penitent: Act of Contrition

After the Act of Contrition, the priest will give you Absolution.

Penitent: At the end of the Absolution say Amen (make the sign of the cross).

Priest: Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good.

Penitent: His mercy endures forever.

Priest: Dismisses the penitent in peace.

Mysteries of the Rosary

Joyful: the Annunciation, the Visitation, the Birth of Our Lord, the Presentation in the Temple, and the finding of Our Lord in the Temple.

Sorrowful: the Agony in the Garden, the Scourging at the Pillar, the Crowning with Thorns, the Carrying of the Cross, and the Crucifixion and Death of Our Lord.

Glorious: the Resurrection of Our Lord, the Ascension of Our Lord into Heaven, the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, the Assumption Of Our Blessed Mother into Heaven, and the Coronation of Our Blessed Mother in Heaven

Luminous: the Baptism of Our Lord in the Jordon River, the Wedding at Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom, the Transfiguration of Our Lord, and the Institution of the Eucharist.

Hail, Holy Queen

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our Life, our Sweetness, and our Hope. To Thee do we cry poor banished children of Eve. To Thee do we send up our sighs mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions but in your mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

The Angelus

Leader: The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary:

All: And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.

Hail Mary....

Leader: Behold the handmaid of the Lord: **All:** Be it done unto me according to Thy word.

Hail Mary . . .

Leader: And the Word was made Flesh:

All: And dwelt among us.

Hail Mary . . .

Leader: Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God,

All: That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Leader: Let us pray:

All: Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts; that we, to whom the incarnation of Christ, Thy Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by

His Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of His Resurrection, through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.

Nicene Creed
