From Father:

This Sunday, we mark the Fifth Sunday of Lent, traditionally known as Passion Sunday, and with it, we enter a particularly solemn time of Lent known as Passiontide. Passiontide, the final two weeks leading up to Easter, invites us to reflect more deeply upon the profound mystery of Christ's Passion, His suffering, and His sacrificial love poured out for us.

This year, at our parish, we are reintroducing the meaningful tradition of veiling the statues and sacred images within our church. You will notice that the beauty and familiarity of our holy images are temporarily hidden from view, draped in purple cloth. This practice might seem unusual or even unsettling at first glance, but it holds deep significance for our spiritual journey.

By covering our statues and images, we participate in a spiritual fast—not only from certain foods or comforts, but even from the visual beauty that often uplifts and consoles us. This intentional deprivation helps us shift our gaze more intensely toward Christ Himself, who emptied Himself and embraced the suffering of the Cross for our salvation.

During these final days leading to Holy Week, let the veiled statues remind us that our faith is ultimately centered not in symbols or images, but in the person of Jesus Christ and His redeeming sacrifice. As we journey closer to Calvary, may this stark simplicity guide our hearts to recognize the depth of God's love, preparing us to celebrate the profound joy of His Resurrection.

Let us embrace Passiontide with open hearts, united as a parish family, focusing our prayers, sacrifices, and reflections on the One who gave everything out of love for us.

WHY DO WE COVER STATUES AND CRUCIFIXES?

Catholic churches veil crucifixes, statues, and other religious items from the **Fifth Sunday of Lent** to the beginning of the **Easter Vigil**. This practice is done to focus our attention on the **words spoken at Mass** and to heighten our anticipation of **Easter Sunday**.



PASSION SUNDAY

"Passion Sunday" marks the beginning of a special sub-season called Passiontide, which extended up until Holy Saturday. During this time the Church's liturgy became more somber and a sorrowful mood was reflected in the various practices that occurred in the liturgy. The most obvious example of a more somber mood was the veiling of statues and images.

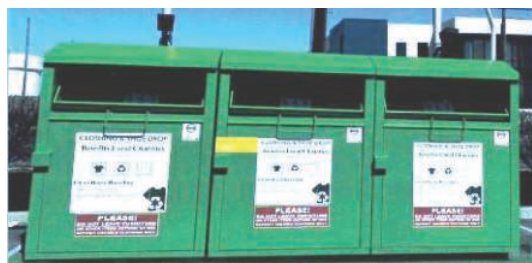
New Knights Welcomed



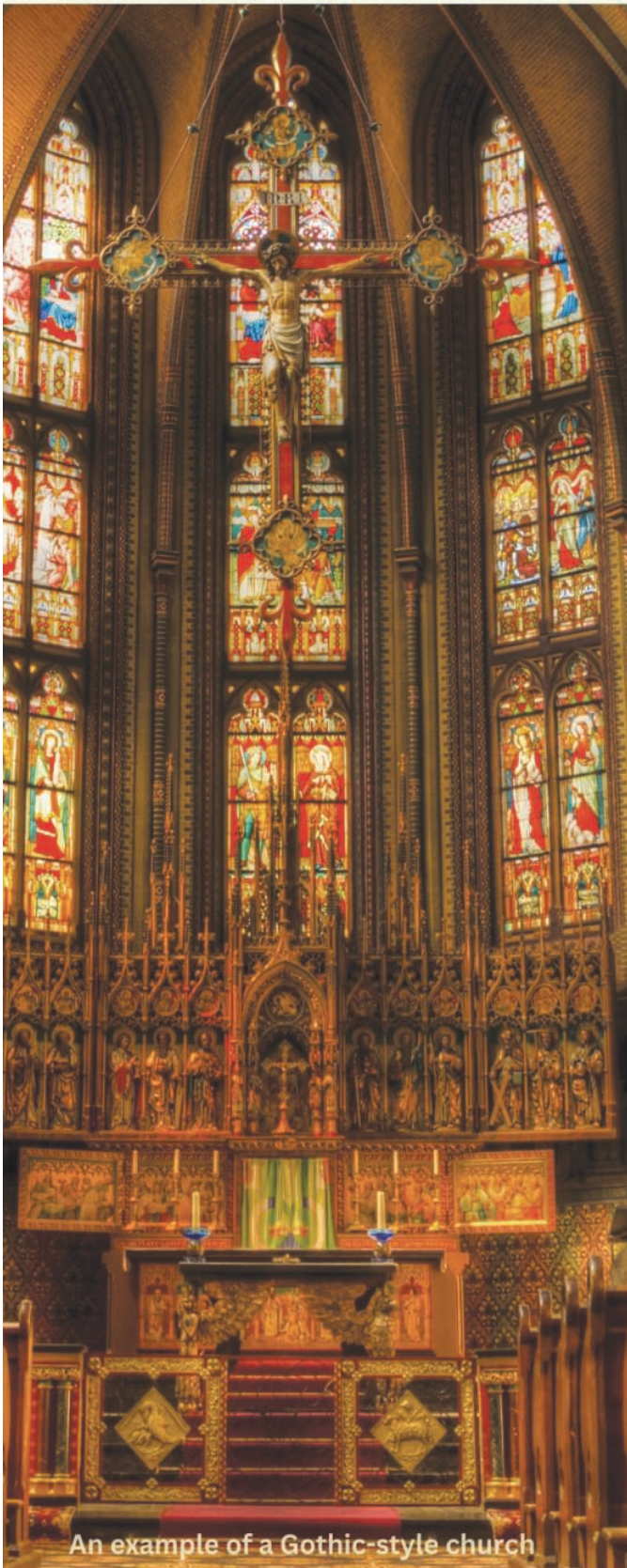
