From Father:

In this Sunday's second reading, the Letter to the Hebrews urges us: "Let us persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus." The image is vivid—life is a race, not a sprint but a marathon, and the Christian life requires endurance.

Endurance is not simply stubbornness or gritting our teeth; it's the steady, faithful commitment to keep going even when the way is long, the obstacles are many, and the rewards are not yet in sight. Every worthwhile goal in life—whether raising a family, pursuing a vocation, caring for someone who is ill, or working toward a noble cause—demands endurance. We live in a culture that prizes instant results and quick fixes, but the most important things are never achieved overnight. They are won through perseverance.

The same is true in the life of faith. There will be moments of great joy and consolation, but there will also be seasons of dryness, doubt, and fatigue. In those times, Hebrews reminds us to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus—He endured the Cross for the joy set before Him. He is our model, our strength, and our goal.

The saints understood this well. They did not become holy by avoiding difficulties but by remaining faithful through them. Like runners, they cast off every burden—sin, discouragement, and fear—so they could run freely toward Christ.

Perhaps today you feel the weight of life pressing down. Let this reading remind you that God's grace enables endurance. Pray for the strength to keep going, to rise each time you fall, and to finish the race well. One day, by God's mercy, we will cross the finish line into the joy of His Kingdom.

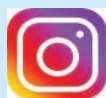

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
