Pastoral Strategies for an Apostolic Age

From Father:

This Sunday, as we continue through Ordinary Time, we're reminded that the Church is never "ordinary"—especially in the way she helps us journey toward heaven. One beautiful and often misunderstood treasure of our Catholic faith is the practice of indulgences. In a world that struggles with the idea of sin and forgiveness, indulgences remain a powerful expression of God's mercy, the Church's maternal care, and our call to ongoing conversion.

So what is an indulgence?

An indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. Let's unpack that. When we sin, we incur guilt (which is forgiven in the Sacrament of Confession) and consequences or "temporal effects" that remain, like wounds in the soul or disorder in our hearts. Indulgences are the Church's way, through the treasury of grace won by Christ and the saints, to heal those wounds and restore us more completely to spiritual health.

The Catechism says, "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for sin, the guilt of which has already been forgiven..." (CCC 1471). Think of it like this: if you broke a window and your parents forgave you, the forgiveness is real—but the window still needs to be repaired. Indulgences help repair the damage our sins have done.

A Brief History

The practice of indulgences dates back to the early Church, when those who committed grave public sins would undergo long penances. In time, the Church recognized that through prayer, works of mercy, and acts of devotion—especially united to the Cross of Christ—this temporal punishment could be remitted more quickly. Though abuses sadly occurred in the late Middle Ages (which the Church corrected at the Council of Trent), indulgences have always been grounded in Scripture and Tradition, especially the Church's authority to bind and loose (cf. Matthew 16:19).

How Do We Receive an Indulgence?

There are two kinds: plenary (full remission of temporal punishment) and partial (remission of part of it). To gain a plenary indulgence, the faithful must:

1. Be in a state of grace.
2. Have complete detachment from sin—even venial sin.
3. Go to Confession (within 20 days before or after the indulgenced act).
4. Receive Holy Communion (preferably on the same day).
5. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
6. Perform the indulgenced act (such as praying the Rosary in a church, making a Eucharistic Holy Hour, going on certain pilgrimages, or walking the Stations of the Cross).

These are not "hoops to jump through," but moments of encounter with Christ and opportunities for grace.

Why Do Indulgences Matter?

Because they remind us that the Church is a communion of saints—that our prayers and sacrifices are not isolated but joined to the Body of Christ. They help us take sin seriously, but also mercy more seriously. They are a reminder that our actions, even hidden ones, have eternal consequences, and that God's mercy is not just about forgiveness, but about healing and transformation.

Let us rediscover this beautiful practice, not as a relic of the past, but as a real, living expression of God's mercy today. In a world hungry for grace, indulgences are a spiritual medicine for the soul—offered not as a burden, but as a gift.

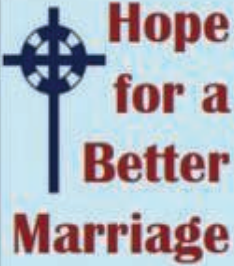

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.
