Hosted by the Parish Life Committee

From Father:

This Sunday the Church celebrates the great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is the final Sunday of the liturgical year, and the Church deliberately closes the year with this feast so that we remember how everything—history, the Church, our own lives—has a goal and a center: Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. He is not simply a wise teacher or a distant religious figure. He is the King to whom every knee shall bow and in whose Kingdom alone we find true peace.

Of course, when we hear the word “king,” we might think of earthly power, armies, and political rule. Christ's Kingship, however, is of a very different kind. In the Gospel, standing before Pilate, Jesus says, “My kingdom is not of this world.” His throne is the Cross, His crown is of thorns, and He rules not by force but by love and mercy. He conquers not by crushing His enemies but by allowing Himself to be pierced for our sake. Yet His is the only Kingdom that will last forever. All nations, all governments, all worldly powers rise and fall—but Christ remains.

This feast is not just about “out there” or “up in heaven.” It is a personal question for each one of us: Is Christ truly King in my life? It is one thing to say the words in a prayer or sing them in a hymn; it is another to let Him reign over our thoughts, choices, relationships, and priorities. To proclaim Christ as King means that His teaching shapes how I live, that His grace has the final say over my sins and failures, and that His Sacred Heart is the true center of my home and family.

Fittingly, this week we also celebrate Thanksgiving Day, our national holiday of gratitude. As Catholics, we can see a beautiful connection between Christ the King and Thanksgiving. The very heart of our worship is the Eucharist, and the word “Eucharist” itself means “thanksgiving.” At every Mass, we offer thanks to God the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit, for the saving work of Christ our King—His life, death, and resurrection offered for us. Before we ever make a list of blessings—family, friends, health, work, parish—we begin with the greatest gift of all: Jesus Himself, given to us in the Eucharist.

Thanksgiving is a good time to examine what kind of “kingdom” we build in our own hearts and homes. Is our home a place where Christ is honored—where prayer has a place at the table, where Sunday Mass is non-negotiable, where forgiveness can be asked and given, where the poor and those in need are remembered? Or is it easy for other “kings” to take over: comfort, busyness, entertainment, resentment, or anxiety? If Jesus is truly King, then gratitude, mercy, and trust in God should be noticeable marks of our lives.

I am personally very grateful for the many ways our parish reflects the Kingship of Christ—through your faithfulness at Mass, your generosity, your service to the poor, your devotion to prayer, and your love for one another. These are the signs of a parish where Christ truly reigns. Thank you for the countless, often hidden ways you place the Lord first and allow His grace to bear fruit in our community.

As we close this liturgical year, let us once again place ourselves under the banner of Christ our King. Let us renew, in our hearts and in our homes, the simple and profound act of faith: “Jesus, You are my Lord and my King. Reign in me. Reign in my family. Reign in our parish.”

A blessed feast of Christ the King, and a grace-filled, happy Thanksgiving to you and your loved ones.

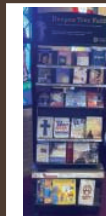

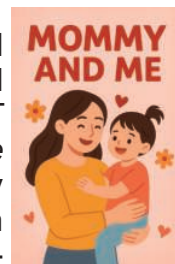

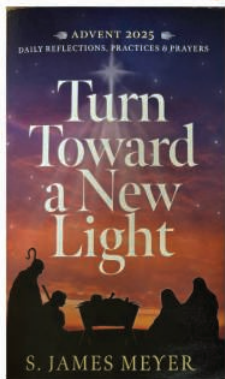

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
