From Father:

This weekend we step into a new year of grace: the holy season of Advent.

"Advent" means "coming." The Church invites us over these four weeks to ponder the three comings of Christ:

1. His coming in history – as a Child in Bethlehem.

2. His coming in mystery – in the sacraments, in His word, and in the quiet work of grace in our souls.

3. His coming in majesty – at the end of time, when He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead.

The First Sunday of Advent focuses especially on this **final coming of Christ**. The Gospel each year gives us the same basic command from the Lord: "Stay awake...be ready." The world around us is already busy with Christmas—decorations, shopping, noise, and hurry. But the Church, like a wise mother, slows us down and teaches us how to wait. Advent is less about "getting everything done" and more about **learning how to watch and to hope**.

The darkening days of late autumn are a kind of parable. As the light fades earlier outside, the candles on the Advent wreath slowly grow brighter each week. The message is simple but powerful: **Christ is the Light who enters our darkness**. He comes into a world marked by war, confusion, and sin. He comes into homes that are sometimes strained, hearts that are often tired, and lives that feel pulled in many directions. And yet He comes—quietly, humbly, faithfully.

How, then, do we live this season well?

- *time for silence*. Advent is a season of listening. Even ten quiet, intentional minutes a day—turning off the phone, closing the laptop, and placing ourselves consciously in the Lord's presence—can change our hearts.
- *Return to Confession*. One of the best ways to "be ready" for the Lord is to let Him cleanse and heal us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Nothing prepares the soul for Christmas like a good confession.
- *Pray with Scripture*. Consider reading the Gospel of the coming Sunday ahead of time, perhaps as a family. Ask: What is Jesus saying to me? What needs to change in my life so I am truly awake to Him?
- *Keep Advent as Advent*. We do not have to refuse every party or avoid every Christmas carol, but we can be intentional: maybe hold off on some decorations until closer to Christmas, or keep a more quiet, penitential spirit in the home. The Church gives us these purple vestments and a more restrained liturgy for a reason—it is a time of preparation, longing, and holy desire.

A final thought: Advent reminds us **that history is going somewhere**. Our lives are not a series of random events. Christ has come, Christ is coming now in grace, and Christ will come again in glory. Every Mass, every Rosary, every hidden act of charity is a way of opening the door a little wider to Him.

As we light the first candle on the Advent wreath this Sunday, let us ask for the grace to begin again. May this season not pass by as just another countdown to December 25th, but as a real spiritual renewal—a time when we allow the Lord to awaken us, purify us, and deepen our hope.

Come, Lord Jesus. Make our hearts ready for Your coming.

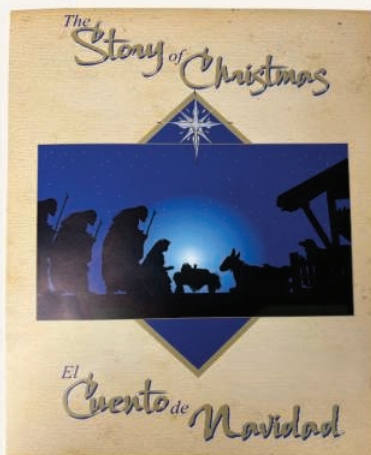


Merry Christmas

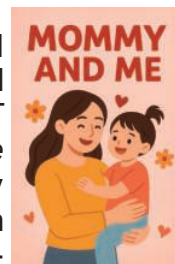

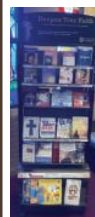

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
