

Parish Pastoral Council Nomination and Election Process
John Beichert ~ Pulpit Announcement
Jan. 8-9, 2022

Thank you for the opportunity to briefly share with you today. We are going to discuss community, OUR community here at Epiphany of Our Lord. Welcome to 2022 and the latest wave of COVID. While it may seem like *de ja vu* all over again, all indications are that this will be fleeting and we will soon be back to our new reality. When this pandemic began, our houses of worship were closed. Thankfully, almost all of the restrictions on our ability to worship together have been lifted. Accordingly, despite these past almost two years of pandemic darkness, adversity has revealed many points of light shining here at Epiphany of Our Lord. OUR Parish Community has provided inspiration for many.

Throughout the last 22 months, our parish life continued to shine. For instance, our Walking with Purpose women's prayer group has not only survived but continues to increase in size. There are now three separate community groups together growing in faith and fellowship. Once again, our Serve Our Neighbor Committee conducted a remarkable turkey drive in which our previous record donations were surpassed yet again. This year, the Serve Our Neighbor Committee will partner with the St. Vincent DePaul Society to provide further comfort and support to the less fortunate in our communities. A special thank you to Bud Yanak and others for their leadership in these endeavors. Our annual Gaudemus Christmas Concert returned with a stirring live performance right here at Epiphany. Thanks to Connie Steuer for sharing this remarkably talented group of musicians. A further thanks goes to everyone involved in our music ministries, including our new choirs. Just this week, we were able to reverently celebrate our community's 65th Anniversary with a day of eucharistic adoration and an inspirational Anniversary Mass. Perhaps most importantly, our young people have been able to continue to receive their Sacraments. I even hear there is an increase in weddings scheduled for 2022!

Magnificently, some of the pandemic casualties have been reestablished. Our monthly coffee and donuts socials in which we gather together and strengthened our community ties have been established once again. The very successful Lenten Soup and Song event has been scheduled for March 25, 2022 in our Parish Center. Please mark your calendars for what promises to be an invigorating event that will benefit those in need in our communities. Our vibrant Parish Life Committee has been hard at work with even more surprises planned for us as the year unfolds. Of course, the addition of Father Jeff has been a blessing for us all.

Our community has come back strong. I am certain that all of you hope that 2022 sees the momentum of involvement continue to feed the fire of our community growth in spirit and numbers.

This brings me to opportunity. I am here to alert you to an opportunity to be a part of the light shining here at Epiphany. An opportunity to more closely advance our community goals. I am referring to nominations for our Parish Pastoral Council.

I would like to briefly outline the purpose of the Parish Pastoral Council. The Council serves as an advisory board to our Pastor. It is a think tank. It provides members of the laity an opportunity to deliberate on and participate in the planning of the future direction of OUR Parish Community. Again, it is a chance to be a point of light.

The Council meets six to 10 times a year on the third Tuesday of each month. During the meetings, all voices are heard. Younger parishioners are particularly encouraged to consider running for a seat on the Parish Pastoral Council. The three-year term of office will begin in September 2022.

Please reflect on members of our community. Do you perceive someone who can keep our community on the right path along our faith journey? Do you discern a calling of your own? Once again, we are particularly encouraging young people to consider serving on the Parish Pastoral Council.



Holy Rosary Review

Holy Rosary's first grade teacher, Ms. Maddie Pierson, challenged her students to write a step by step guide on how to decorate the perfect Christmas tree. They began by putting their designs and decorations on paper. Part of their research included studying Santa's elves and investigating elf jobs at the North Pole. They accomplished this by reading elf biographies online. The students were then further challenged to write their guide from the perspective of one of Santa's most helpful elves. They were tasked with explaining in detail the elf's jobs, his hobbies, and interests. The finale of the project was "elfing" themselves and making a craft that portrayed themselves as an elf!

Our second grade is studying poetry with the help of their teacher, Ms. Kelly Barrett. They began this study by listing all of the poems that they know, and watched a video that explained each type. For the writing piece of their study, they chose to focus on acrostic poems with Santa as the topic. Once they mastered the steps of building an acrostic poem, they were ready to create their own. Together they brainstormed to assemble a large list of descriptive words for jolly, old Saint Nick. After rough drafts, editing, and revising were completed, the final product was ready. The students are so proud now to be called poets!


