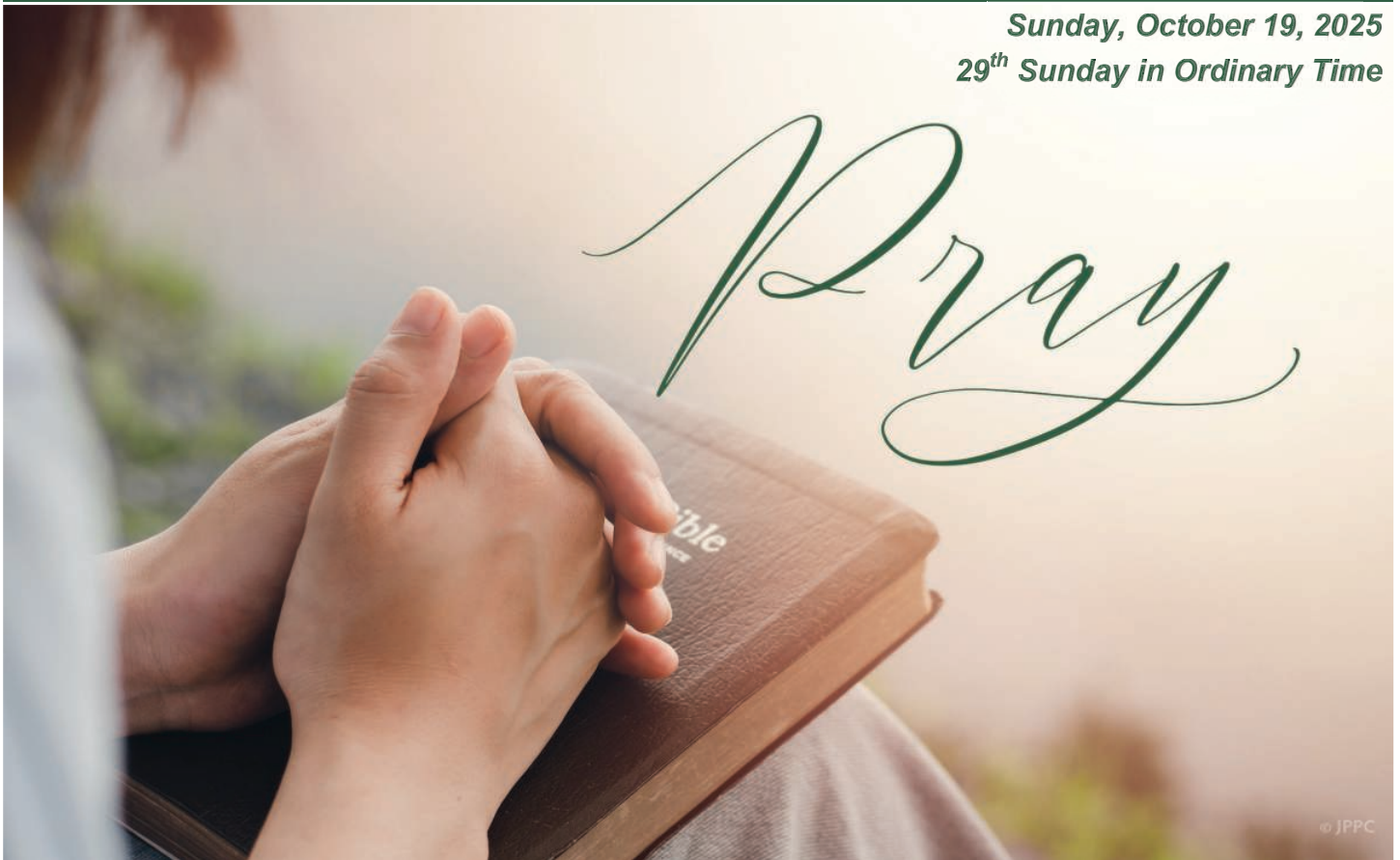

From Father:

Greetings from Lisieux! I'm writing to you from the hill of the great basilica, where the air itself seems hushed with prayer. Lisieux is beautiful in a simple, luminous way—quiet streets, the Carmel where Saint Thérèse lived hidden with God, and her family home, Les Buissonnets, which still whispers the ordinary kindnesses that formed a saint. It is peaceful here, and deeply consoling.

This week I have the joy of celebrating the 100th anniversary of Saint Thérèse's canonization (1925–2025) and, at the same time, the 10th anniversary of the canonization of her parents, Saints Louis and Zélie Martin (2015–2025). A daughter and her parents—canonized within a century of one another—remind us that sanctity is meant to be a family affair. Grace is not abstract; it is learned in kitchens and parlors, through bed-time blessings, patient conversations, shared burdens, and small sacrifices offered with love.

Providentially, this Sunday's Gospel (the Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time) speaks of perseverance in prayer. That is the Martin household in one sentence. Thérèse called it her "little way": not dramatic feats, but daily fidelity—prayer done steadily, duties carried out cheerfully, and the tiniest acts offered to Jesus with great love. Louis and Zélie embodied the same spirit: hard work, Sunday worship, tender discipline, generosity to neighbors, and trust in God through hardship. Their family life became a school of prayer and charity, and from that ordinary school the Church received a Doctor of the Church.

What might the Martins teach our families—yours and mine—today?

1) Make the home a chapel of daily prayer. Keep prayer simple and steady: grace before meals, a decade of the Rosary in the evening, a brief examination of conscience with the children. Regularity matters more than length; the rhythm forms the heart.

2) Give the gift of presence. Saints are formed by eye contact, unhurried listening, and the habit of putting the phone down. Love has a face and a voice; let yours be calm and available.

3) Practice the three golden words. "Please, thank you, I'm sorry." They cost little and heal much. In Lisieux, I'm struck by how courtesy and kindness seemed to be the household language.

4) Keep Sunday holy. Mass together, a family meal, some restful time—this is how we let God reorder the week. The Eucharist (thanksgiving) is the furnace in which grateful families are forged.

5) Offer small sacrifices. A hidden act of service, a bite of dessert given up, a chore done without being asked—these are the bricks of a holy home. Thérèse turned such smallness into a path to Heaven.

6) Persevere. Prayer is not always sweet. Family life is not always easy. The Gospel's lesson is clear: do not lose heart. Keep praying, keep loving, keep forgiving. Grace works quietly, like spring water through stone.

Standing at Thérèse's tomb, I prayed for our parish—especially for our families: for parents striving to be patient, for children learning obedience and joy, for grandparents who steady us by their wisdom, for those carrying grief or illness, and for those longing for reconciliation. May the Martins intercede for us, that our homes become places where Christ is loved and each person is helped toward Heaven.

From this peaceful town I send you a blessing and my affection. Know that I carry you to the altar here in Lisieux, and I will bring these prayers home to our own altar next Sunday.

Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, pray for us.
Saints Louis and Zélie Martin, pray for us.

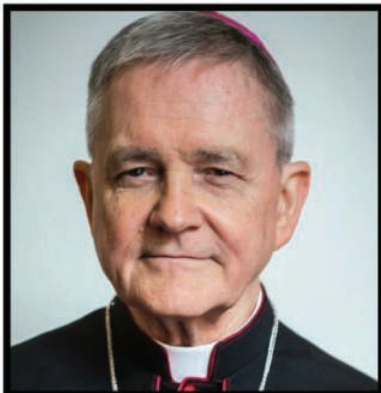

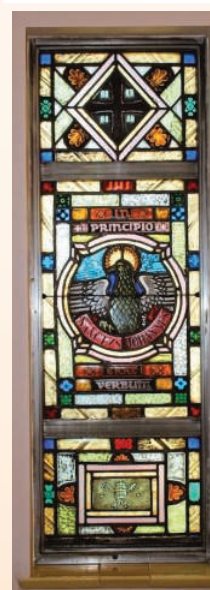

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

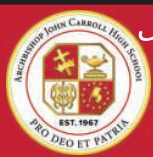
