From Father:

We have now entered the holy season of Lent, a time set aside for spiritual renewal through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These three disciplines are not mere obligations but rather the ingredients for a fruitful Lent, helping us draw closer to Christ and conform our hearts more fully to His.

Prayer deepens our relationship with God. Just as Jesus spent forty days in the desert in communion with the Father, we are called to set aside distractions and seek Him with greater intentionality. Lent invites us to carve out more time for silence, Scripture, and devotion, allowing the Lord to speak to our hearts.

Fasting is not simply about giving up certain foods or habits; it is about detaching from worldly comforts so that we may hunger more for God. When we deny ourselves, we are reminded that we do not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God (cf. Mt 4:4). Fasting cultivates discipline and strengthens our will, training us to resist temptation and rely more on grace.

Almsgiving opens our hearts to the needs of others. Lent is a time to practice generosity—not just in giving money, but also in giving of our time, attention, and love. It is a season to grow in charity, remembering that what we have is meant to be shared with those who suffer.

Lent is part of the rhythm of the Christian life, a sacred time that calls us to step away from excess and return to simplicity. Just as nature follows the rhythm of seasons—times of growth, times of harvest, times of dormancy—our spiritual lives need periods of feasting and fasting. The world often tells us to indulge without restraint, to avoid sacrifice at all costs, but God in His wisdom gives us this sacred season to refocus our lives. There is a time to celebrate, but there is also a time to fast, to purify, and to make room for God.

As we embark on this Lenten journey, let us embrace this time of holy discipline. Let our prayer be more fervent, our fasting more intentional, and our generosity more heartfelt. If we do so, we will arrive at Easter not only having endured Lent but having been transformed by it.

What is Jubilee 2025 - Pilgrims of Hope?

The Catholic Church celebrates a Holy Year or Jubilee every 25 years.

2025 is a Jubilee year, the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." The concept of "Jubilee" has its origins in the Book of Leviticus (chapter 25) as a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home. Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope."

Tradition dictates that each Jubilee is proclaimed through the publication of a Papal (or Pontifical) 'Bull of Indiction'. A 'Bull' is an official document, generally written in Latin, that has the seal of the Pope. By participating in the Jubilee, a pilgrim can be granted a plenary indulgence. "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven..." [Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and in the Catechism (n. 1471)]

Characteristics of the Jubilee

Holy Doors - there are 5 for Jubilee 2025 (all are in Rome). These openings are significant events, emphasizing themes of mercy, forgiveness, and hope. ~ St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, this is the most renowned Holy Door. It was opened December 24, 2024, to commence the Jubilee and will close on January 6, 2026, marking the Jubilee's conclusion ~ St. John Lateran Basilica at the official cathedral of Rome ~ St. Mary Major Basilica ~ St. Paul Outside the Walls Basilica ~ Rebibbia Prison was a historic first location.

Pilgrimages - The Jubilee calls for us to set out on a journey. A pilgrimage is an experience of conversion, of transforming one's very being to conform it to the holiness of God. Also, the faithful are encouraged to visit the font of their Baptism, where their pilgrimage of hope began as Christians.

Indulgences - The Jubilee Indulgence is a concrete manifestation of God's mercy. This treasury of grace entered human history in the witness of Jesus and the saints, and by living in communion with them our hope for our own forgiveness is strengthened and becomes a certainty. In practical terms, the experience of God's mercy involves some spiritual acts indicated by the Pope.

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.
