From Father:

In this Sunday's first reading, the Teacher, Qoheleth, cries out: "Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" It is one of the most sobering lines in all of Scripture, and perhaps one of the most freeing. Qoheleth reflects on the truth that no matter how hard one works, no matter how much wisdom, knowledge, and skill one applies, every possession and achievement will one day be left behind. What we gain through years of effort will pass into the hands of others who may not value it, preserve it, or even remember us. And so the Teacher calls it a "great misfortune," one that fills the human heart with sorrow and anxiety, even robbing us of rest at night.

The point of these words is not to lead us into despair or cynicism. They remind us instead to see reality clearly. Earthly goods, success, comfort, and reputation are not evil in themselves. They have their place. But if we treat them as ultimate, as the foundation of our happiness, they become empty pursuits. They will never satisfy the deepest desires of our souls, and they will all pass away.

There is a striking moment in *A Man for All Seasons*, the story of St. Thomas More, when More confronts Richard Rich, who has betrayed him in exchange for a small political office in Wales. Grieved by Rich's choice, More says, "Why Richard, it profits a man nothing to give his soul for the whole world... but for Wales?" More's words cut to the heart. No reward, no matter how great—or how small—is worth the cost of losing our integrity, our peace, and ultimately our soul before God. To live for what fades away is the truest vanity.

Qoheleth's cry finds its answer in Christ. Jesus tells us not to "store up treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume," but to "store up treasures in heaven" (cf. Matthew 6:19-20). When we live for the Lord, our labor—no matter how ordinary—takes on eternal meaning. Our daily work, our relationships, and even our sufferings can all become offerings to God, building up a treasure that will never be lost.

The question for each of us is simple: Are we living for what endures, or for what fades away? The world constantly promises that the next possession, the next achievement, the next title will finally bring peace. But true peace comes only when our restless hearts rest in God. When we live with heaven in view, we discover that even the smallest acts of love, the simplest duties fulfilled, and the quiet sacrifices we make each day are anything but vanity—they become seeds sown for eternity.

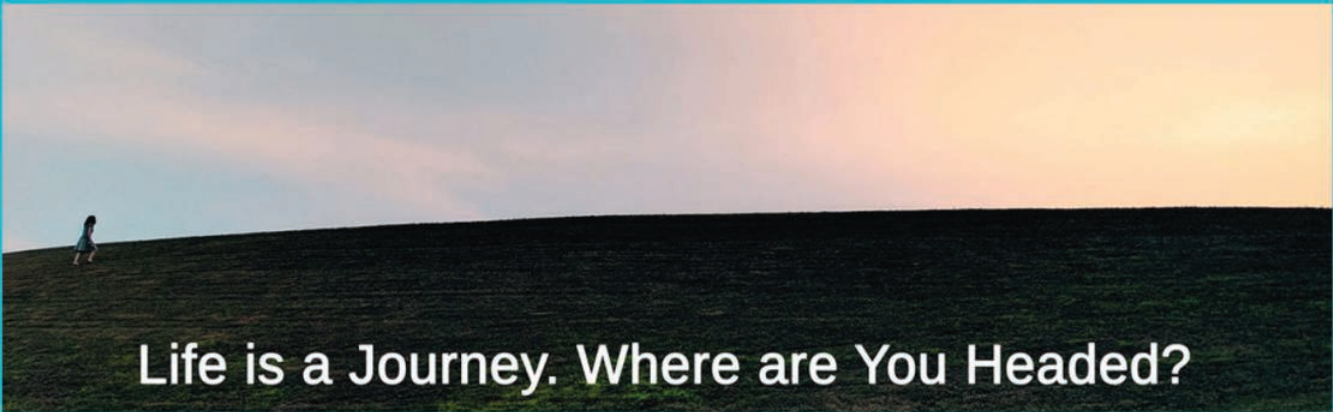

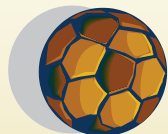

Anointing of the Sick

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.
