The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Monday, Dec. 8 is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses for the Immaculate Conception will be at 8:30 a.m., 12:05 p.m. and 7 p.m.

From Father:

On this Second Sunday of Advent, we hear again the cry of John the Baptist: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

Advent is meant to be a quiet, penitential, hope-filled season. Yet December often feels like the noisiest, most frantic month of the year. If we're not careful, Christmas arrives and our hearts are no more ready for Jesus than they were weeks ago.

So I'd like to propose a simple Advent discipline—a small, concrete "rule" you can live each day, even in the middle of the busyness. It's rooted in the Church's spiritual tradition and meant to be realistic, not overwhelming.

A Simple Advent Practice

Once a day—in the morning, before bed, or in the chapel—place yourself in the Lord's presence and walk through these seven points. You might jot them on a card and keep it in your Bible or bring it to the Adoration Chapel.

Ask the Lord to help you choose, for this Advent:

- 1. One prevalent vice** Ask honestly: "Lord, what is really tripping me up right now?" It might be impatience, anger, gossip, laziness, impurity, envy, distraction, or something else. Name it clearly before God. This is your "crooked path" that needs straightening.
- 2. One opposite virtue** For every vice there is an opposing virtue: Impatience → Patience; Anger → Meekness; Gossip → Charity in speech; Laziness → Diligence. Choose one virtue and make it your Advent "training ground." Ask: "Lord, help me practice this virtue in small, concrete ways today."
- 3. One gift of the Holy Spirit** From the prophet Isaiah, the Church names seven gifts: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear (reverence) of the Lord. Which do you especially need? If you feel weak: fortitude; If you feel confused: wisdom or counsel. If prayer feels dry: piety or fear of the Lord. Pray simply: "Come, Holy Spirit, give me the gift of _____ today."
- 4. One fruit of the Holy Spirit** The fruits include charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity. Choose one to especially desire this Advent. At day's end, briefly review: "Where did I see this fruit? Where did I resist it?" Little by little, the Spirit will shape your reactions and your heart.
- 5. One Beatitude** The Beatitudes are a portrait of Christ's own Heart and a roadmap for ours. Pick one—for example, "Blessed are the poor in spirit..." "Blessed are the merciful..." "Blessed are the peacemakers..." Read it slowly each day and ask: "Lord, how are You inviting me to live this Beatitude today—in my family, at work, in traffic, in conversation?"
- 6. One spiritual work of mercy** These include instructing the ignorant, counseling the doubtful, comforting the afflicted, forgiving offenses, bearing wrongs patiently, and praying for the living and the dead. Choose one. In this season, it might be: Comforting someone who is grieving; Bearing wrongs patiently amid family tensions; Praying more intentionally for specific people; Ask: "Lord, show me one soul I can serve in this way."
- 7. One corporal work of mercy** These include feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, sheltering the homeless, visiting the sick or imprisoned, and burying the dead.

Advent offers many opportunities: a food drive, a gift for a family in need, a visit to someone homebound, help at a shelter, attending a funeral, or a simple act of generosity. Choose at least one concrete act you will carry out this season.

The Second Sunday of Advent

On this Second Sunday of Advent, light two violet candles on your Advent wreath and ask God for the strength to be like John the Baptist, preparing the way of the Lord.

This year, the *Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception* is observed today. Attend Mass and pray the Rosary, if possible.

9

I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus. *Philippians 1:6*

10

In the bustle of the holiday season, spend some time this week in silence and prayer, possibly before the Blessed Sacrament, to prepare your heart to receive the **peace** of the Lord at Christmas.

11

Today is **Christmas Jumper Day**. Wear your most outrageous holiday sweater. The idea comes from the United Kingdom where they wear a festive, often quirky, sweater and donate to support children in need.



12

Today is the **Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe**. Our Lady of Guadalupe reminds us that God's un-failing love encompasses all of us, regardless of immigration status, race, nationality, and all other differences.

13

On this Memorial of Saint Lucy, patron saint of persons who are blind, consider ways that your parish, community, and other groups can become more welcoming to persons with disabilities.

A rich Christmas tradition from Polish heritage, the blessed Oplatki wafers are embossed with a Christmas scene of the Nativity or the Blessed Virgin Mary holding Baby Jesus. On Christmas Eve, families share the wafers with each other along with loving wishes for the Christmas Season and New Year.

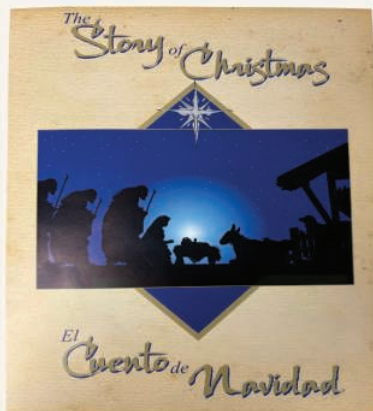

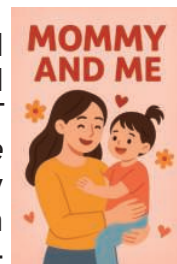

There is a bin in the back of church to leave your donations. No glass jars, no opened food or expired food can be accepted. Thank you!



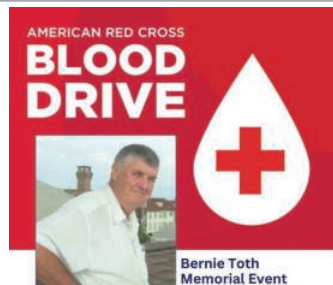

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Our Policy is to keep you safe when the weather causes hazardous conditions for travel. Your safety is our concern.

- If Colonial has a two-hour delay, the parish office/rectory building will open two hours late.
- If Colonial is closed, the parish office/rectory building is closed.
- If Colonial has a two-hour delay or closes, our 8:30 a.m. Mass will be canceled, and the Mass intention will be celebrated privately by the priest.
- If you have questions or need help rescheduling cancelled meetings please call the parish office when we reopen.
- For emergencies, please call Father O'Donald directly.

Parish Office Requests

To register in the parish, arrange for a baptism, or request a Certificate of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, contact the Parish Office during office hours at eol@epiphanyofourlord.com.

Also, please advise our office staff of any change of address, telephone number or family status.

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.

Holy Communion for the Sick and Homebound

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the sick and homebound. Call the Parish Office at (610) 828-8634 to provide the office staff with the name, address and phone number of the sick or homebound parishioner.
