From Father:

This Sunday the Church pauses in the middle of Advent to whisper a word we all need to hear: Gaudete – Rejoice.

The Third Sunday of Advent takes its name from the first word of the Entrance Antiphon in Latin: "Gaudete in Domino semper – Rejoice in the Lord always" (Phil 4:4). The tone of the liturgy shifts today. Advent is still a time of penance and preparation, but the joy of the nearness of Christ begins to shine through more clearly. It is as if the Church gently opens the curtains to let a little more light into the room.

That is why the priest may wear rose-colored vestments and why the rose candle is lit on the Advent wreath. Rose is not a denial of purple, but a softening of it. It reminds us that our prayers, sacrifices, and acts of charity in this season are not meant to be gloomy burdens, but loving responses to a God who is drawing near. The Lord is close. Salvation is not an abstract idea; it is a Person who comes to us.

In the Gospel for this Sunday, we usually meet John the Baptist again – the great Advent figure. He stands in the desert and cries out: "Prepare the way of the Lord." John reminds us that the right way to welcome Christ is conversion: turning away from sin and back to God with our whole heart. The joy of Gaudete is not superficial cheerfulness, but the deep peace that comes when our hearts are right with God.

The Church, like a good mother, not only tells us to prepare, she gives us the concrete means to do so. One of the most beautiful ways to live Gaudete Sunday is to make a good confession in these final days before Christmas, so that the Lord may find in us not a cluttered, neglected heart, but a place made ready for Him.

*With that in mind, I invite you very warmly to our **Advent Confession Service this Tuesday, Dec. 16, from 7:00-8:00 PM.***

We will have four guest priests available to hear confessions, in addition to the regular parish opportunity for confession. There will be quiet time in church for prayer and reflection. Perhaps it has been a long time since your last confession. Perhaps you are not sure where to begin or you worry that you have forgotten "how to do it." Please don't let that keep you away. The priest is there to help you. The important thing is to come with a sincere heart, to be honest with God, and to trust in His mercy. There is no sin stronger than the Blood of Christ. There is no past that He cannot forgive and renew.

Gaudete Sunday tells us that joy is not found in more shopping, more noise, or more frantic activity. Joy is found in Christ. It is found when we let Him into the places we are most afraid to show Him. It is found when we allow the grace of the sacraments—especially Confession and the Eucharist—to cleanse, strengthen, and console us.

As we light the rose candle this Sunday, let it be a little reminder that there is still time in this Advent to turn back, to reconcile, to forgive, to begin again. Please consider making our Advent Confession Service on Tuesday a priority for you and your family. Bring your burdens, your sins, your worries, and lay them before the Lord. He longs to say to each of us:

"Rejoice in the Lord always... the Lord is near."

May this Gaudete Sunday fill your heart with hope, and may the mercy you receive in the confessional prepare a worthy place for the Christ Child in your soul this Christmas.

The "O Antiphons" of Advent

The Roman Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the Magnificat canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah.

December 17

*O Wisdom of our God Most High,
guiding creation with power and love:
come to teach us the path of knowledge!*

December 18

*O Leader of the House of Israel,
giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai:
come to rescue us with your mighty power!*

December 19

*O Root of Jesse's stem,
sign of God's love for all his people:
come to save us without delay!*

December 20

*O Key of David, opening the gates
of God's eternal Kingdom:
come and free the prisoners of darkness!*

December 21

*O Radiant Dawn,
splendor of eternal light, sun of justice:
come and shine on those who dwell in darkness
and in the shadow of death.*

December 22

*O King of all nations and keystone
of the Church: come and save man, whom
you formed from the dust!*

December 23

*O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law:
come to save us, Lord our God!*

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Reconciliation (also known as confession or Penance) is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in His love and mercy to offer sinners forgiveness for offenses committed against God. At the same time, sinners reconcile with the Church, because it is also wounded by our sins.

Rite of Reconciliation

Priest gives a blessing or greeting.

Make the Sign of the Cross and say, *"Bless me, father, for I have sinned My last confession was [give weeks, months, or years],"*

Confess all of your sins to the priest. (If you are unsure or uneasy, tell him and ask for help) Say, *" I am sorry for these and all of my sins."*

The priest assigns a Penance and offers advice to help you be a better Catholic.

Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, then absolves you from your sins.

Act of Contrition

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of your just punishments; but most of all because they offend you, my God,. who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of your grace to sin no more and avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.

Every time we sin, we hurt ourselves, other people, and God. In Reconciliation, we acknowledge our sins before God and his Church. We express our sorrow in a meaningful way, receive the forgiveness of Christ and his Church, make reparation for what we have done, and resolve to do better in the future.

To make a good confession we review our lives since our last confession, searching our thoughts, words, and actions for that which did not conform to God's command to love him and one another through his laws and the laws of his Church. This is called an examination of conscience.

To make an examination of conscience:

- Recall your sins
- Prayerfully ask yourself what you have done with full knowledge and full consent against God's will and the Church's commandments.
- See next page for examination of conscience.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

1. I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD. YOU SHALL NOT HAVE STRANGE GODS BEFORE ME.

Do I give God time every day in prayer?
Do I seek to love Him with my whole heart?
Have I been involved in witchcraft, superstition or black magic?
Have I received Communion in a state of mortal sin?
Have I deliberately told a lie in Confession or withheld a mortal sin in Confession?

2. YOU SHALL NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD YOUR GOD IN VAIN.

Did I curse or swear? Did I use God's name in vain, lightly, carelessly, by blasphemy?
Have I wished evil upon another person?
Have I been angry with God and stayed in that state of anger?
Have I insulted a sacred person or abused a sacred object?

3. REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE LORD'S DAY.

Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of obligation?
Have I tried to observe Sunday as a family day and a day of rest?
Do I get enough rest or am I constantly running?
Do I do needless work on Sunday?

4. HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER.

Do I honor and obey my parents? Am I respectful towards them?
Have I neglected my duties to my spouse and children?
Have I given my family good religious example and try to bring peace into the home?
Do I care for my aged and infirmed relatives?

5. YOU SHALL NOT KILL.

Have I had an abortion or encouraged anyone to have an abortion?
Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization, etc.?
Have I harbored anger or resentment or hatred in my heart?
Have I physically harmed anyone? Have I driven recklessly (too fast, showing off, etc.)?
Have I abused alcohol or drugs?
Have I hurt myself through cutting, scratching, or in any other way?

6. YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY.

Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage (intercourse, oral sex, inappropriate touching, mutual masturbation)?
Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
Have I been guilty of masturbation? Have I entertained lustful thoughts?
Have I been guilty of any homosexual activity?
Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, and actions?
Was I "immodest" in the way I dressed, acted or spoke (leading others to arousal)?
Are my words, texts and photos on Facebook and/or other social media sites sexually charged?
Did I look at pornography or visit chat rooms that were inappropriate?

7. YOU SHALL NOT STEAL.

Have I stolen what is not mine?
Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
Did I waste time at work (which is really stealing from the company)?
Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?

8. YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR.

Have I lied? Have I gossiped? Have I spoken behind someone else's back?
Do I always tell the truth? Did I reveal secrets that should have been kept confidential?
Am I sincere in my dealings with others?
Am I critical, negative, or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
Is what I write in my emails, IM's, text messages or on any social media sites true about myself or others?

9. YOU SHALL NOT DESIRE YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE.

Have I caused impure thoughts by impure reading, movies, conversations or curiosity?
Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?

10. YOU SHALL NOT DESIRE YOUR NEIGHBOR'S GOODS.

Am I jealous of what other people have?
Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
Am I greedy or selfish?
Are material possessions the purpose of my life?

Parish Office Requests

Anointing of the Sick
