

Did You Know?

The History of the Pretzel



At one point in time, the faithful were to abstain from eggs, fat and milk during Lent. Pretzels were baked to fulfill this requirement.



Monks shaped the pretzels to resemble the common prayer position of the time: arms crossed over the chest with hands on the shoulders.



It is thought that the name *pretzel* is derived from the Latin word *pretiola* meaning "little reward" as the pretzels were often given to children as a reward for reciting their prayers.

EXCERPTS FROM THE MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR LENT 2021

“Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem” (Mt 20:18); Lent: a Time for Renewing Faith, Hope and Love

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our Lenten journey towards Easter, let us remember the One who “humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross” (Phil 2:8). During this season of conversion, let us renew our faith, draw from the “living water” of hope, and receive with open hearts the love of God, who makes us brothers and sisters in Christ. At the Easter vigil, we will renew our baptismal promises and experience rebirth as new men and women by the working of the Holy Spirit. This Lenten journey, like the entire pilgrimage of the Christian life, is even now illumined by the light of the resurrection, which inspires the thoughts, attitudes and decisions of the followers of Christ.

Fasting, prayer and almsgiving, as preached by Jesus (cf. Mt 6:1-18), enable and express our conversion. The path of poverty and self-denial (fasting), concern and loving care for the poor (almsgiving), and childlike dialogue with the Father (prayer) make it possible for us to live lives of sincere faith, living hope and effective charity.

In this Lenten season, accepting and living the truth revealed in Christ means, first of all, opening our hearts to God’s word, which the Church passes on from generation to generation. This truth is not an abstract concept reserved for a chosen intelligent few. Instead, it is a message that all of us can receive and understand thanks to the wisdom of a heart open to the grandeur of God, who loves us even before we are aware of it. Christ himself is this truth.

Fasting, experienced as a form of self-denial, helps those who undertake it in simplicity of heart to rediscover God’s gift and to recognize that, created in his image and likeness, we find our fulfilment in him. In embracing the experience of poverty, those who fast make themselves poor with the poor and accumulate the treasure of a love both received and shared. In this way, fasting helps us to love God and our neighbor, inasmuch as love, as Saint Thomas Aquinas teaches, is a movement outwards that focuses our attention on others and considers them as one with ourselves (cf. Fratelli Tutti, 93).

The Samaritan woman at the well, whom Jesus asks for a drink, does not understand what he means when he says that he can offer her “living water” (Jn 4:10). Naturally, she thinks that he is referring to material water, but Jesus is speaking of the Holy Spirit whom he will give in abundance through the paschal mystery, bestowing a hope that does not disappoint. Jesus was speaking of the future opened up by the Father’s mercy. Hoping with him and because of him means believing that history does not end with our mistakes, our violence and injustice, or the sin that crucifies Love.

In these times of trouble, when everything seems fragile and uncertain, it may appear challenging to speak of hope. Yet Lent is precisely the season of hope, when we turn back to God who patiently continues to care for his creation which we have often mistreated (cf. *Laudato Si’*, 32-33; 43-44). Saint Paul urges us to place our hope in reconciliation: “Be reconciled to God” (2 Cor 5:20). By receiving forgiveness in the sacrament that lies at the heart of our process of conversion, we in turn can spread forgiveness to others.

In Lent, may we be increasingly concerned with “speaking words of comfort, strength, consolation and encouragement, and not words that demean, sadden, anger or show scorn” (Fratelli Tutti, 223). In order to give hope to others, it is sometimes enough simply to be kind, to be “willing to set everything else aside in order to show interest, to give the gift of a smile, to speak a word of encouragement, to listen amid general indifference” (ibid., 224).

To experience Lent in hope entails growing in the realization that, in Jesus Christ, we are witnesses of new times, in which God is “making all things new” (cf. Rev 21:1-6). It means receiving the hope of Christ, who gave his life on the cross and was raised by God on the third day, and always being “prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls [us] to account for the hope that is in [us]” (1 Pet 3:15).

Love, following in the footsteps of Christ, in concern and compassion for all, is the highest expression of our faith and hope. Love rejoices in seeing others grow. Hence it suffers when others are anguished.

Love is a gift that gives meaning to our lives. It enables us to view those in need as members of our own family, as friends, brothers or sisters. A small amount, if given with love, never ends, but becomes a source of life and happiness. Such was the case with the jar of meal and jug of oil of the widow of Zarephath, who offered a cake of bread to the prophet Elijah (cf. 1 Kings 17:7-16); it was also the case with the loaves blessed, broken and given by Jesus to the disciples to distribute to the crowd (cf. Mk 6:30-44). Such is the case too with our almsgiving, whether small or large, when offered with joy and simplicity.

Holy Rosary's 2021 Catholic Schools Week was a huge success despite missed "in school" days because of snow. We began the week with a Prayer Service which was led by sixth grade students. We then headed outside clutching our thank you posters, and flanked by mountains of snow we saluted our community's First Responders with a "Beep Out." Their vehicles drove through the school campus, heavy on the horns as we cheered for them. We even made two showings on Channel 6 that day! This special week also included themed dress down days- "twin day", "dress like a teacher" and "future career" day. Another activity enjoyed was an afternoon of school wide bingo where prizes included wearing a sweatshirt of your choice for a day, or an extra five points added to a test. Throughout the week we collected supplies for CHOC, Coordinated Homeless Outreach Center. Our vestibule overflowed with generous donations from our families. We presented the pastors of our parishes with a Thank You Spiritual Bouquet. Each child promised prayers, colored their page of promises and then all were combined into four booklets. We created a Kindness Quilt where each student decorated a paper hand. The hands were joined together to show that we are working as one to treat each other as Jesus taught us.

Another project included families ornamenting a leaf to add to our family tree that was painted on the wall by our art teacher. The leaves showcased the virtues that the families espouse. Both the quilt and tree walls were originally meant to be temporary, but they are such beautiful reminders of who we are, that we decided to make them permanent. As new families join us we will ask them to add a leaf to the tree. The week ended with our annual Talent Show. Even though it was virtual, the talent, enthusiasm and fun were obvious. We are blessed to have such a wonderful and active school family!
