From Father:

As we journey deeper into Lent, the readings become more profound, calling us to pause and reflect on who God truly is and how we respond to His presence in our lives. This Sunday, our first reading from Exodus gives us a powerful and intimate glimpse into the identity of God.

Moses encounters God in a burning bush—a remarkable sign of divine presence that draws Moses into conversation with the Lord. When Moses asks for God's name, he receives a profound response: "I am who am." This revelation isn't merely God stating His name; it's an expression of His eternal, unchanging, and active presence. God reveals Himself as the foundation of all existence, always present, always faithful.

The words "I am who am" assure us that God's presence and care are constant, even when our lives are uncertain, difficult, or confusing. Just as God promises to be with Moses and the Israelites in their struggles, He promises us His unwavering presence today. Lent is an invitation to rediscover this truth, to turn back to Him and find strength in His faithfulness.

Reflecting on this revelation, we can ask ourselves: How do we experience God's "I am" in our own lives? Are we aware of His presence in moments of joy, sorrow, challenge, and peace? God desires not only to be known by us but to be actively welcomed into every aspect of our lives. During this Lent, may we open our hearts more fully to the God who is always present, whose name is Love itself.

May the assurance of God's presence, His everlasting "I am," give us strength and hope as we continue our Lenten journey, drawing ever closer to the mystery of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection.

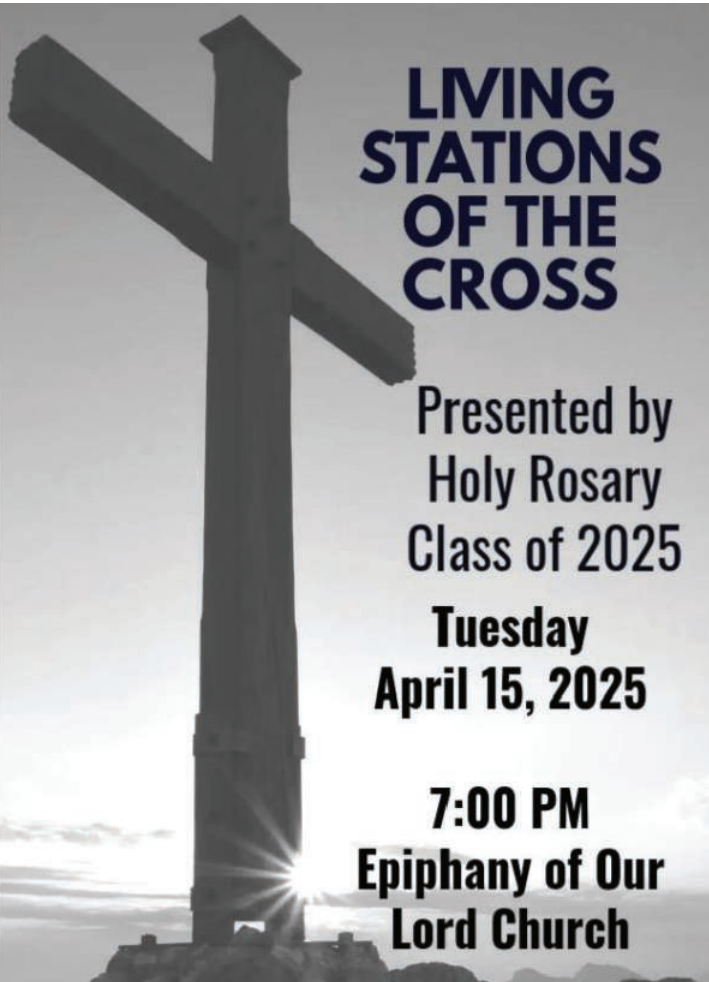

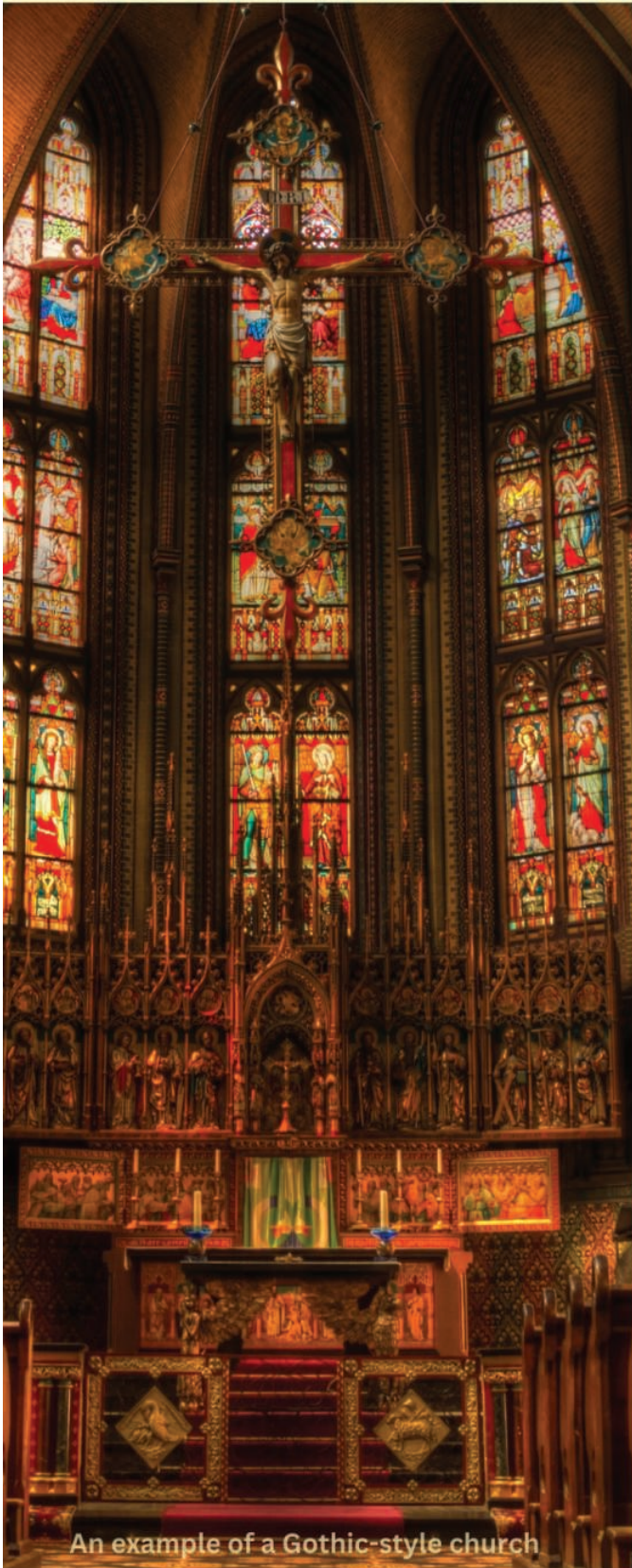

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month.

Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
