From Father:

This Sunday the Church turns our eyes to Nazareth—to Jesus, Mary, and Joseph—and in doing so, she teaches us something very practical: holiness is most often learned and lived in ordinary places, through ordinary people, with ordinary duties.

The Second Vatican Council famously called the family the “domestic church.” That phrase is not pious poetry; it is a description of what God intends your home to be. In a parish church, we gather around the altar to worship, to hear the Word, to receive the sacraments, and to be formed as disciples. In the domestic church, those same realities take root in daily life: faith is taught, love is practiced, forgiveness is learned, virtues are trained, and sacrifices are offered—often quietly, often without applause, but never without meaning.

Consider the Holy Family. Nazareth was not a stage. It was a workshop, a kitchen, a small home with real fatigue and real bills and real responsibilities. And yet it was there—through work, obedience, prayer, patience, and mutual charity—that the Son of God “grew and became strong” and “advanced in wisdom and age and favor” (cf. Lk 2:40, 52). In other words, the saving work of Christ was not only announced in the Temple; it was also prepared in the routines of family life.

That is why the family matters so much for sanctity. The home is the first school of love. It is where children learn what it means to belong, to be corrected, to be encouraged, to be forgiven, to share, to tell the truth, to keep promises, to respect authority, to care for the weak, and to pray. And it is where adults learn the same lessons again—sometimes more painfully, and therefore more fruitfully. Family life has a way of revealing both our best and our worst. That is not a reason to despair; it is precisely the raw material God uses to sanctify us.

If you want a simple definition of sanctity, it is this: learning to love as Christ loves. And where do we practice that kind of love most consistently? In the concrete demands of home: changing plans for the sake of another; listening when you're tired; showing gentleness when you would rather be sharp; keeping fidelity when no one is watching; bearing one another's burdens; choosing reconciliation instead of resentment. Families do not become holy because they are perfect. Families become holy when they let God meet them in imperfection—and keep turning back to Him together.

So what does a domestic church look like in practice?

It looks like Sunday Mass as the non-negotiable anchor—not merely “when we can,” but the center around which the week is built. It looks like a home where the name of Jesus is spoken naturally and reverently, where grace before meals is not an awkward relic, but a habit of gratitude. It looks like a crucifix on the wall and the Rosary within reach. It looks like parents who bless their children, and children who learn to honor their parents, even as they grow into adulthood. It looks like a family that can say, without drama and without delay: “I'm sorry. Please forgive me.” Those words are not weakness; they are strength. They are how peace is restored and love is protected.

It also looks like the courage to be different. Our culture often treats the family as a convenient arrangement or a fragile contract. The Gospel treats it as a vocation—a mission. Christian families are called to be a sign: that faithful love is possible, that life is a gift, that children are not burdens, that the elderly are not disposable, that marriage is not a private preference but a public witness, and that holiness can be lived in the middle of carpools, homework, caregiving, and long days at work.

This feast also speaks hope to those who carry real wounds: strained relationships, divorce, absent parents, infertility, grief, addiction, or a family member who has drifted from the faith. The Holy Family is not held up to make anyone feel ashamed. It is held up to remind us that God enters real human life to redeem it. If your family story is complicated, the Church does not turn away from you. She invites you to begin again—perhaps with one small act: a prayer together, an apology offered, a boundary set with charity, a phone call made, a return to Mass, a candle lit before a crucifix. God works with small beginnings.

On this Holy Family Sunday, ask the Lord for one grace for your household: that your home would be a place where Christ is welcome. Not in theory—in the way you speak, the way you forgive, the way you spend time, the way you treat the vulnerable, the way you honor the Lord's Day, and the way you pray. If we do that, our families will not only be places of comfort; they will be paths to sanctity.

May Jesus, Mary, and Joseph guard our homes, strengthen our marriages, bless our children, console those who mourn, heal what is broken, and make each of our families—imperfect but beloved—a true domestic church.

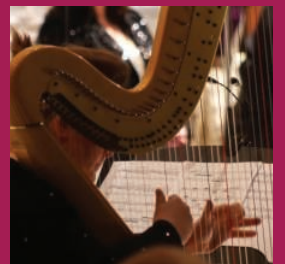
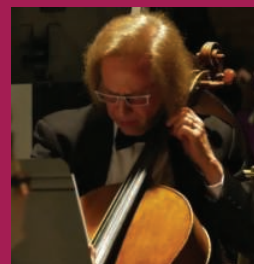


From the Musicians of Gaudeamus

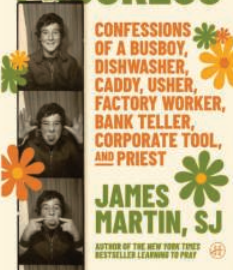

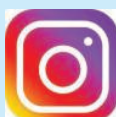

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

The safety of all who visit our Church campus is our primary concern when the weather forecast is hazardous.

- **Based on their action, we implement a corresponding delayed opening or a closing of our Church campus spaces (office, meeting rooms, and chapel). For a delayed opening, access to all campus buildings will be 10:30 a.m.**
- Both weather-related decisions results in our 8:30 a.m. Mass being canceled, however, the Mass intention will be celebrated privately by the priest.
- If you need to reschedule canceled meetings please call the parish office when we reopen.
- For emergencies, please call Father O'Donald directly.

Parish Office Requests

To register in the parish, arrange for a baptism, or request a Certificate of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, contact the Parish Office during office hours at eol@epiphanyofourlord.com.

Also, please advise our office staff of any change of address, telephone number or family status.

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.

Holy Communion for the Sick and Homebound
