From Father:

Our Lord watches guests elbow for the places of honor and gives a simple command: take the lowest place. In His Kingdom, humility isn't a strategy to get noticed; it's the shape of love. "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then He presses further: when you host a banquet, don't invite those who can pay you back. Invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind. Bless those who cannot return the favor, "and you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Two movements run through this Gospel: where we choose to sit and whom we choose to serve. Both speak powerfully to Labor Day weekend.

First, where we sit. In a world that rewards self-promotion, Jesus directs us to the lowest place. At the Eucharistic Banquet, none of us has earned a seat; all is gift. We come as beggars, and the Lord calls us "Friend" and lifts us higher than we deserve. To take the lowest place is not to think less of ourselves; it is to think of ourselves less. It is to let Christ set the terms of honor, not the crowd. Practically, that means we listen before we speak, we offer thanks before we complain, we yield rather than demand, and we choose hidden service over visible recognition. In families, ministries, and workplaces, such humility is the oil that keeps the gears from grinding.

The Church, in her tradition, teaches that work is not a punishment but a participation in God's own creative care for the world. St. Joseph the Worker reminds us that ordinary tasks—measured and patient—can be holy. "Ora et labora," pray and work, is not a slogan but a way of life. We pray to do our work well and honestly; we work so that our prayer bears fruit in service. At the same time, the Lord commands Sabbath rest. We are not machines; we are sons and daughters. Rest is not laziness; it is trust. We lay down our tools because God is God and we are not.

Finally, a word of thanks. Our parish is blessed by so many who labor with love—teachers and staff, maintenance and grounds crews, volunteers who clean linens, arrange flowers, count offerings, and set out chairs; readers and musicians, catechists and coaches, nurses and first responders, tradesmen and small-business owners, caregivers at home. Much of this work is unseen by most and known fully only to God. Taking the lowest place, you make room for Christ to "move you up higher."

May St. Joseph the Worker teach us the nobility of steady labor; may Our Lady, Seat of Wisdom, teach us the humility of the hidden place; and may the Sacred Heart make our homes, our parish, and our workplaces schools of charity.

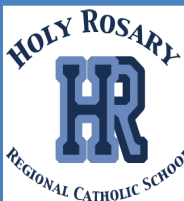

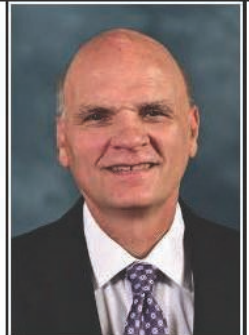

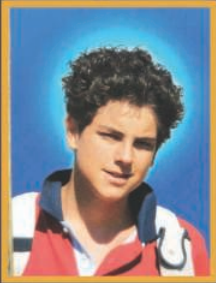

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
