

65th Anniversary Homily by Father James J. Kelly



Every anniversary has a history. So, I will begin by highlighting briefly a few events of the Epiphany of Our Lord Parish. Maybe there are a few here this evening who were present when it was founded on Jan. 6, 1957, by Cardinal O'Hara. There might even be a few who knew and remember Father Joseph F. Grady, the founding pastor.

The construction of the school and convent began on Oct. 1, 1957. The first floor of the school was used as a church with a seating capacity for 518 people, and the school, staffed by the Sisters of St. Joseph, opened its doors for 500 students. A new rectory was constructed in 1959. Ground was broken for a new church in July 1962. Cardinal Krol officially dedicated the new church on May 26, 1971.

Father Richard J. McAndrews was appointed pastor on June 26, 2002, and undertook the task of many needed renovations. New beautiful stained glass windows and doors were installed, the marble Baptismal Font, and the marble sanctuary.

On the occasion of the Golden Jubilee, Jan. 7, 2007, Cardinal Rigali offered a Mass of Thanksgiving in this newly renovated church. Tonight, we thank our loving God as we celebrate the 65th Anniversary.

One of the most beautiful jewels of the Epiphany Church is the magnificent stained glass window over the entrance of this church. It pictures Mary, our Blessed Mother, holding her child, God's Eternal Son, on her lap. Over her head, a star is shedding golden rays of heavenly glory. We see St. Joseph standing on the right gazing at the child.

The Magi, those wise men from the East, have been led by the star and are kneeling before the newborn king. Tradition tells us that their names are Melchior, Balthasar and Caspar. They are asking: "Where is the newly born King of the Jews? We have seen his star in the East and have come to worship Him." King Melchior is on the left, kneeling with folded hands offering his gift of gold; King Balthasar is at the bottom on the left with his gift of incense; and King Caspar is at the bottom right with a gift of myrrh. These gifts signify: gold, His kingship; incense, His divinity; and, myrrh, His mortality.

One of the St. Joseph Sisters told me that the children in the school gave their nickels and dimes, and held many fund raisers to pay for this exquisite gift of art. So, when you enter this church, keep in mind that Mary will be looking down upon you. Her Son is waiting for you in the Golden Tabernacle. Accept His invitation: "Come to me, all you who are heavily burdened and weary and I will refresh you...Ask and you will receive...Knock and the door will be opened."

When you enter the vestibule of the Epiphany Church, a Statue of St. Anthony greets you. He is one of my favorite saints. So often we say that prayer: "St. Anthony, please come around, something is lost and can't be found." He seems to help us

find the things we have misplaced or lost and can't be found.

Now if you were to walk around the church, you see on the right side of this main altar a statue called the Pieta. The original, carved by Michelangelo, is in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. If you ever visit Rome, you will find it on the right side as you enter. The original Pieta was commissioned by a French Cardinal Jean de Billheres as a funeral monument for his tomb in 1498. Michelangelo told his biographer that he overheard someone remark that his Pieta was the work of another sculptor, Ascanio Condivi. So, returning at night he carved his name in Latin, Michelangelo Bonaroti, in the sash running across Mary's breast. It was the only work he ever signed.

Now let us focus on the tabernacle. Its history has its roots in the Old Testament. When the Israelites were wandering in the desert a tent or tabernacle was erected in the center of the Israelite camp. The Ten Commandments that God had inscribed in stone were enclosed. Today in this beautiful Golden Tabernacle are ciboria containing the Body of Christ. Jesus is present here under the appearance of bread. How fortunate and blessed that we can receive God's Son into our very being under the appearance of bread. Jesus tells us: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood, abides in me and me in Him."

On a bright sunny day, visit these beautiful stained glass windows. They will tell you about the history of your church. On the right side of the church you will see: Adam and Eve; Abraham and his son Isaac; the Call of Moses; John the Baptist; King David; the Transfiguration; and, the Resurrection. On the left side of the church you will see: Pentecost; St. Paul; St. Francis Xavier; St. Patrick; St. Francis Cabrini; St. Katharine Drexel; and, Pope St. John Paul II.

Now we must walk behind the main altar, hidden from view, to admire the windows of St. John Bosco, the patron of altar servers; St. Therese of the Child Jesus, where flowers are arranged; St. Charles Borromeo, patron of the seminary where priests study; and, St. Joseph the Worker. The Apostles are also to be seen: St. Peter, St. Andrew, St. James the Great, St. John, St. Philip, St. Bartholomew, St. Thomas, St. Matthew, St. James the Less, St. Simon; St. Matthias, and, St. Jude.

Did you ever have to remember the names of the 12 Apostles? The Sisters gave us a mnemonic, the word 'Baptism' to remember the names of the 12. There are four Apostles whose names begin with the letter "J", two with the letter "M", two with the letter "P", and, one each with the letters A, B, and S. I think we got a 100 on our exam test if we remembered. The small 18 stained glass windows on the right and left of the main altar are called clerestory windows. They depict symbols and figures of liturgical events.

Let me end this liturgical and historical homily with a prayer: "Lord, you knew me before I knew you. You loved me before I learned to love you. Fill my heart with your love and peace. Take my hand as I strive to walk in your way. Be with me until you call me home to see you. Face to face. Amen."


In early 2021, we were given the opportunity to apply for a grant entitled Emergency Assistance to Non Public Schools (EANS), which is part of the governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund. The goal of the grant is to provide services or assistance to eligible non-public schools to address the impact that Covid-19 has had, and continues to have, on non-public school students and teachers in the state. Holy Rosary was eligible for a substantial amount of this funding, and we immediately set to work researching what our students would most benefit from to enhance their education. To date, we have received:

- New math series for the lower grades,
- Additional Chromebooks that now provide a device for each student in grades 2-8,
- Newer version of iPads for each PreK, Kindergarten, and first grade student,
- Lunch tables that completes the GYM renovation project,
- Reading/writing centers for the lower grades,
- New furniture for our Innovation Lab and two Science labs and,
- Licenses for learning apps.

This is only the beginning; we look forward to the delivery of 19 state of the art smartboards this spring. We are already enjoying two of these smartboards now because of a science grant we were awarded last year.



It is wonderful to see our students achieving even more success as a result of this grant. Come and see for yourself.
