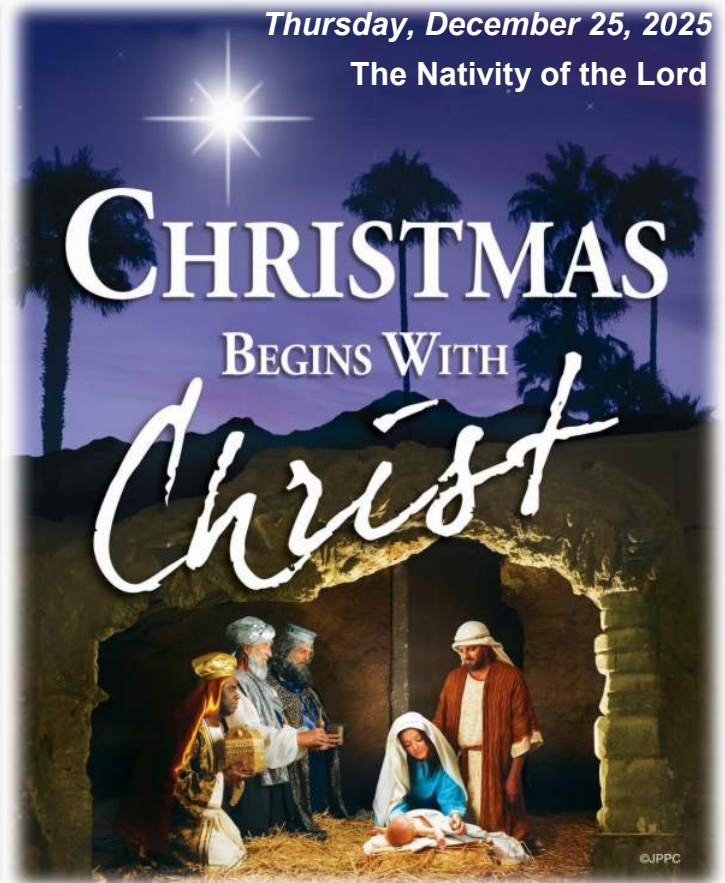

From Father:

As we arrive at the Fourth Sunday of Advent, the Church places us quietly in Nazareth, before a young woman whose whole life is about to be changed by a single sentence: "Let it be done to me according to your word." Mary's fiat is not sentimental. It is courageous. It is the doorway through which the eternal God enters time, not with noise, not with force, but with the astonishing gentleness of a Child.

This is the heart of our faith and the source of Christmas joy: the Word truly became flesh. God did not send a message; He came Himself. He did not remain distant; He drew near. He did not merely speak about love; He showed love with a human heart, human hands, and a human voice. The Incarnation is beautiful precisely because it is so humble: the Almighty chooses a mother, a home, a family, and a manger.

And the Incarnation is not only beautiful—it is necessary. Why would God come so close? Because we needed more than advice. We needed healing. We needed rescue from sin and death. We needed a Savior who could truly stand where we stand, suffer what we suffer, and lift what we cannot lift on our own. In Jesus Christ, God enters our real condition—work and weariness, joy and sorrow, friendship and betrayal, hunger and tears—so that nothing genuinely human is outside His redeeming love.

Christmas, then, is not a charming story to be revisited once a year. It is a revelation of God's identity and our own.

It tells us who God is: not a distant ruler, but Father—so committed to us that He becomes one of us.

It tells us who we are: not accidents or burdens, but creatures of immense dignity—worth the coming of God.

It tells us what the world is for: not despair, but hope; not meaninglessness, but communion with Him.

This is why the Church has always guarded the truth of Christmas so fiercely: God is truly God, and truly man. Not half-and-half. Not a symbol. Not a myth. A real Child, born of the Virgin Mary, laid in a manger—Emmanuel, "God with us." If this is true (and it is), then life is not empty, suffering is not pointless, and sin does not get the last word.

There is another tenderness here: God's desire to be received. A baby does not impose himself; he is welcomed—or refused. The Lord comes in a way that asks for room: room in the inn, room in the heart, room in the home, room in the schedule. He comes still with that same humility. And that is why Advent and Christmas belong together: Advent teaches us to make space, so Christmas can be more than a day—so it can become a grace.

As you prepare for Christmas, I'd encourage a few simple, traditional practices that keep the Incarnation at the center:

Make a good Confession. Let the Prince of Peace find a clean place to rest.

Spend real time in silence. Even ten minutes a day—because wonder is born in quiet.

Honor the manger in your home. A Nativity scene isn't decoration; it's a proclamation.

Come to Mass with reverence and gratitude. The Child of Bethlehem leads us to the altar, where He still comes close—Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity.

On Christmas, we do not escape the world; we see it rightly. We discover that God is not ashamed of our humanity. He enters it, blesses it, elevates it, and redeems it. The manger is the beginning of a road that leads to the Cross—and beyond the Cross to the empty tomb. Christmas already contains Easter in seed form, because the Child is born for us.

May Mary, Mother of God, teach us her interior readiness and her steady joy. And may this Christmas not pass over us like a busy week, but settle into us like a lasting light: God has come near. God is with us. God has taken flesh.

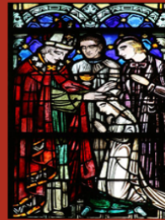

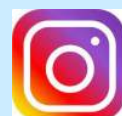
Low Gluten Hosts

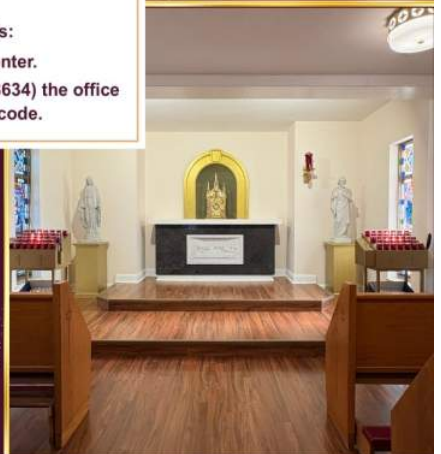
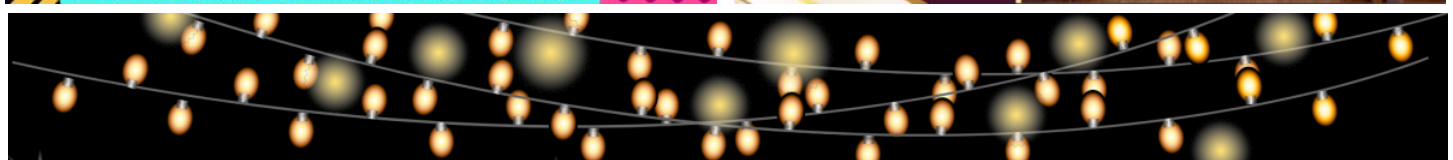

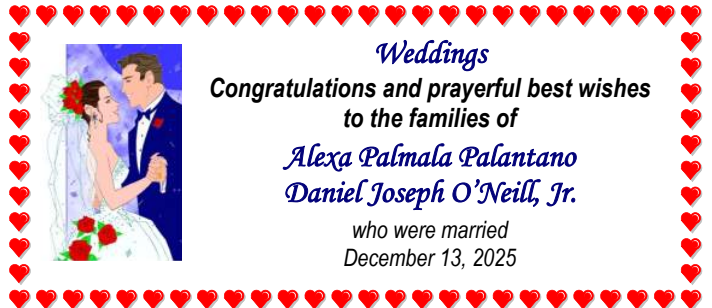

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

The safety of all who visit our Church campus is our primary concern when the weather forecast is hazardous.

- **Based on their action, we implement a corresponding delayed opening or a closing of our Church campus spaces (office, meeting rooms, and chapel). For a delayed opening, access to all campus buildings will be 10:30 a.m.**
- Both weather-related decisions results in our 8:30 a.m. Mass being canceled, however, the Mass intention will be celebrated privately by the priest.
- If you need to reschedule canceled meetings please call the parish office when we reopen.
- For emergencies, please call Father O'Donald directly.

Parish Office Requests

To register in the parish, arrange for a baptism, or request a Certificate of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, contact the Parish Office during office hours at eol@epiphanyofourlord.com.

Also, please advise our office staff of any change of address, telephone number or family status.

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is by request. Please notify the Parish Office as soon as possible when any parishioner becomes seriously ill or is admitted to the hospital.

Baptism

Baptisms are celebrated after the 10 a.m. Mass on Sundays upon request. Both first-time parents need to attend a Pre-Jordan class, which is held the first Wednesday of every month. Pre-Registration for the class is required by contacting the Parish Office. Sponsors not from Epiphany are required to submit a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish two weeks prior to the Baptism.

Matrimony

Notify the Parish Office of your intention to marry at least six months before the date of the wedding to assure sufficient preparation and to arrange for Pre-Cana sessions.
